




The History of Water Skiing

was intrigued by an article I read this winter written by Steve Batchelor on the beginnings of water skiing.

He writes: Water skiing began in 1922 when eighteen-year-old Ralph Samuelson of Minnesota declared that if you could ski on snow you could ski on water. He first tested this theory on Lake Pepin in Lake City, Minnesota, towed by his brother Ben. The two brothers spent several days experimenting before July 2, 1922 when Ralph discovered that leaning back with the ski tips in the air led to successful waterskiing. The next skis the brothers used were made from barrel staves, then they progressed to snow skis before Ralph fashioned the first pair of water dedicated skis from some lumber he purchased and shaped. These skis were bound to the feet with leather straps and a long window sash was used as a tow rope. Ralph continued to experiment with and perfect his waterskiing technique and equipment. On July 8, 1925 during a Lake Pepin exhibition he performed the first ever water ski jump using a 4'by 16' greased ramp. Ralph never patented any of his waterskiing

equipment. That was first done by Fred Waller in 1925 who patented his Dolphin Akwa-Skees. In 1940 Jack Andresen invented the first trick ski, a shorter finless version of the standard ski.

As a result of Ralph Samuelson's work and the development of equipment, waterskiing became an exhibition sport in the late 1920's and 30's. The first competition was staged in 1939 when the American Water Ski Association was formed and held the National Water Ski championships at Jones Beach on Long Island, New York.

There are now an estimated 11 million water skiers in the U.S. alone. ■







Are you Ready to Grill?

n the middle of the winter when I'm out walking I occasionally smell the sweet smoky smell of meat being seared on a grill. But whether you use your grill all year long or store it in the winter, the beginning of the summer season is a good time to make sure your grill is safe and clean.

According to Emili Senneogen, contributor to the TLC cable channel, keeping a clean grill is the secret to great grilling. She says, yesterday's steak marinade won't taste good on today's lime-grilled tilapia. Just like a cast iron skillet, cooked-on flavor can be a good thing but you don't want your grate coated in spices and melted cheese.

Spraying or rubbing your grill grate with a light olive oil coating is a good way to keep meats from sticking, and it also makes for a good grill cleaner. Use a scrub brush or grill scraper to remove the rest of the caked-on food and spice. Simply rinse the grate with water and your grill is nice and clean. You can remove the grates and do the rinsing in the yard to prevent a wet mess in your grill tray.


If you've let your grill get out of hand and it's coated in cooked-on food, you may need to remove the grate and take care of it with some soap and water. This is always a good idea to do at the beginning and the end of the grilling season. If your sink is large enough, you can use it for your soak, otherwise you'll need to use a washtub or plastic bin. Or maybe even your bathtub. Fill the sink or bin with warm soapy dish washing liquid and let the grates soak for at least two hours. The longer you soak it, the easier it will be to get the gunk off. After the soak, remove the grate and scrub it with a stiff wire brush, rinse it and let it dry. Make sure you never use any harsh chemicals like bleach or a chlorine powder. After all, this is what you cook your food on. You can also look for an all-natural, chemical-free liquid soap for your soak.

WHEN YOU GRILL

Make sure your grill is on a level surface and away from your house and overhangs. When using a charcoal grill never add lighter fluid directly to hot coals. Also, when using a charcoal grill place the cover on the grill and close the vents when finished and allow the coals to burn out completely. Let the ashes cool for at least 48 hours and then dispose of the coals in a non-combustible container. If using a gas grill make sure the connection to the gas tank is secure and without leaks.

Grilled Chicken Breasts, 3 Ways

-From Good Housekeeping

This simple recipe for grilled chicken breasts on the bone with crispy skin and juicy meat takes on a new dimension when one of our flavorful mixtures is rubbed under the skin – Sun-Dried Tomato & Basil, Garlic-Herb, or Sage-Butter.

2 whole(s) (about 2 1/2 pounds) bone-in chicken breasts, split 1/2 teaspoon(s) salt

1/4 teaspoon(s) coarsely ground black pepper Choice of Seasoning Mixture, (see below)

Directions

1. Prepare one of the Seasoning Mixtures

- 2. With fingertips, separate skin from meat on each breast half. Rub equal amounts of Seasoning Mixture under skin of each breast. Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper.
- 3. Place chicken on grill over medium heat, and cook about 25 minutes or until juices run clear when thickest part of breast is pierced with tip of knife, turning over once.
- 4. **Sun-Dried Tomato and Basil Seasoning:** In small bowl, mix 2 sun-dried tomatoes packed in seasoned olive oil, minced, and 1/4 cup loosely packed fresh basil leaves, finely chopped.
- 5. Garlic-Herb Seasoning: In small bowl, mix 2 garlic cloves, crushed with garlic press, 1 tablespoon chopped fresh rose-mary, 1 tablespoon olive oil, and 1 teaspoon freshly grated lemon peel.
- Sage-Butter Seasoning: In small bowl, mix 1 tablespoon margarine or butter, softened, and 1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage leaves.

- 2. Remove drumsticks from bag; discard bag with marinade. Place drumsticks on grill over medium heat and cook 15 minutes, turning over once. Cook drumsticks 10 to 15 minutes longer, or until drumsticks are golden and juices run clear when thickest part is pierced with tip of knife, brushing twice with reserved pineapple mixture and turning occasionally.

This was a recipe I obtained from my neighbor Kathy Andersen at a recent holiday party. I loved it so much I asked her for the recipe and we now have it on the catering menu at the Chubby Trout. I tweaked it a little bit because I found out she borrowed it from a co-worker as well!

It's a chilled dip and makes a great dip to pack in the cooler for a day on the lake or a deck party! Smoked Trout is a little tough to find locally so feel free to substitute smoked salmon if you like.

8-10 ounces smoked Rainbow Trout (substitute smoke salmon if cannot find trout)
16 ounces cream cheese
8 ounces sour cream
Three tablespoons capers
Three tablespoons horseradish
One table spoon Old Bay Seasoning
One tablespoon McCormicks Smokehouse Pepper (you can find it at Martins)
One teaspoon cayenne pepper
Dash of sea salt
Box of crusty baguettes or your favorite crackers!

Let cream cheese thaw to room temperature to soften. Blend all ingredients except trout using spatula.

Once blended fold in the smoked trout. Be careful not to break the fish too small as you fold!

Season to taste with smoked pepper or cayenne, if needed depending on how much heat you want to create.

Scoop into serving dish and sprinkle light dusting of Old Bay seasoning on top for color and a little more flavor prior to serving.

Serves 10-12 people.






