

Simonton Lake Area Homeowners' Association Board Update January 26 Board Meeting

The Lake Association board met on January 26th and discussed the following items:

• The Lake Association membership drive will begin in April. It is important to become a member. Senior lake residents get a free membership. Even though the Association gets no dues for a Senior membership, it is still important to join. Our organization gains strength in numbers.

• A complete membership list for the Lake Association will be published in the June newsletter. The membership year for the Association is June 1 to May 31.

• The Simonton Lake Neighborhood Garage Sale is May 2.

• May 20 is the Lake Association Annual Meeting. The Simonton Lake Preservation Trust will be hosting a free dinner at 6:00 and the meeting will follow. Reservations are needed so we don't run out of food.

• We are waiting to receive an IRS tax form 1024 in order to qualify for a non-profit status with the IRS.

Pete's Simonton Lake Tavern Is Forty Years Old!

Pete's Simonton Lake Tavern is marking the 40th year of the family owned business this February. This makes the business one of the oldest family owned restaurant/bars in Elkhart. Pete's story began in February, 1970 when Lou and Pete Kilgren bought the business from Jack Fidler. They had previously purchased a family home on North Shore Drive. Lou's father had owned a tavern on Harrison Street which he later sold. That tavern would became Nicki-D's. In 1950, Kilgrens opened Cappy's on Michigan Street. The restaurant was a take-off of Lou's maiden name, Cappelletti. Pete's has always been a family business. Pete Kilgren ran the bar side of the operation and Lou ran the kitchen. Lou's cooking was a huge element in the success of the bar/restaurant on Simonton Lake. Neighbors could spend the day enjoying lake activities and then have a home cooked dinner and cold drink at their neighborhood tavern. As years went on the Kilgren family members all took a role in the family business.

In December, 1975 Linda married Merle Anderson who had moved here from Southern California. Over the years Merle's responsibilities and participation in the business has varied but for the past several years, Merle has been the driving force at Pete's. For the past two years, Linda has taken on a new family challenge in re-opening Cappy's. The story of that tavern could be saved for another day.

Merle explains that in the old days, workers from factories from the north side of the city would visit the bar at the end of the day. Some days the bar would be jammed with patrons waiting to be served. Due to the loss of many of those factories, changes in driving and alcohol laws now Pete's caters to a slightly different clientele. There seems to also be more emphasis on the dining and entertainment and less as a bar. One thing that hasn't changed is the comfortable, neighborhood atmosphere.

Pete Kilgren passed away in 2003, but his legacy lives on. Pete's has evolved with Merle and Linda's leadership into a neighborhood establishment where "lakers" as well as locals come to enjoy the warm, friendly atmosphere and good food. The addition of the outside patio is a huge asset which people enjoy. Pontoons can pull up, eat on the patio or carry out. There are a lot of ingredients that make up the unique character of a lake community and Pete's is truly an important ingredient at Simonton Lake.

How About a Spring Bike Ride From Pete's

How many times have you said, "I really should get that old Schwinn out and start riding again."? Well, here's your chance. BikeElkhart, a group of bicycle enthusiasts is organizing a series of rides during the 2015 cycling season. This group is not composed of bike racers, but instead recreational riders who believe in "smelling the roses" as



they ride. I have saved the best news for last. The first ride is going to be right here at Simonton Lake. The ride will conveniently begin and end in Pete's

parking lot. There will actually be two courses to choose from. The first course is a six mile route that goes around the lake and a second course, for those who may have already done some riding, is twelve miles in length.

Wednesday, April 8 is the date and 6:00 PM is the start time. You can ride your bike to Pete's and you won't have to worry about transporting you bike/s. Helmets are required and everyone must sign a waiver. The pace will be leisurely. BikeElkhart will provide a leader and guides for each course so no one will get lost of left behind. After the ride you can order a sandwich and frosty beverage while you enjoy conversations with new and old friends. This is a rain or shine event so there are no excuses not to enjoy the fun.

As mentioned previously this is the first ride in the series. Subsequent rides will also be in the first week of the

following months. Different locations will be chosen for each ride. In addition to scenery, food and beverage options will be among the determining factors for site selection. Thank God it will be spring. There's been enough togetherness over here for a while.


Safety Committee



Neighborhood Dredging Information

With the dredging project a go, lake property owners wondered if it would be possible to take advantage of the dredging equipment already being on the lake to do dredging at their own lake front. The Environmental Committee discussed this possibility but put it on hold during the summer and early fall until the final pieces of the dredging plan were put in to place. With that done the committee, in consultation with the dredger, agreed that this would be possible. A plan was developed. **DREDGING AT YOUR BEACHFRONT WILL BE KNOWN AS "NEIGHBORHOOD DREDGING."**

The Environmental Committee plans to hold another informational Meeting sometime later this spring.

To qualify for Neighborhood Dredging:

- You must be a member of the Simonton Lake Area Homeowners Association. Dues is \$30.00 and can be paid using a SLAHA Membership form. Checks should be made out to the SLAHA.
- You must have made a prior contribution of \$500.00 to the general dredging fund. This contribution is payable to The Simonton Lake Preservation Trust and should be mailed to Simonton Lake Preservation Trust, PO Box 469, Elkhart, Indiana 46515. Your donation is tax deductible and you will get a receipt letter for tax purposes.

Here is Information on and Procedure for Neighborhood Dredging

• The cost is **\$10.00 per cubic yard** of sediment removed from your beach. This should be contrasted at the rate you would pay if you did this on your own with a dredging company. In that scenario the cost would be hundreds of dollars per cubic yard.

- You must be a member of the SLAHA, make your \$500.00 donation and pay the cost that will cover your specific neighborhood dredging by April 2, 2015. No dredging can take place at your beach unless all of these qualifications are met.
- You must <u>submit</u> an **Application** for Neighborhood Dredging.
- The dredger and a member of the Environmental Committee will then come to your home and estimate the cost of your project.
- The Environment Committee Members will assist you in securing paperwork including Notice of Intent, permits and agency approvals.
- Once the actual dredging begins the dredger will proceed around the lake in an orderly fashion coming to your area of residence one time and then moving on.
- If the dredger completes your project with fewer cubic yards than what was estimated, then you will be refunded the difference.
- If more cubic yards than was estimated is required to do the job, dredger will contact you prior to removing that sediment so that you can approve the additional cost.
- Property owners are responsible to carry their own insurance.
- Simonton Lake Area Homeowners Association and The Simonton Lake Preservation Trust are not liable for any injuries or damage which occurs during your neighborhood dredging.
- Property owners are responsible for the removal of piers or boat lifts (if applicable) that might impede your neighborhood dredging.

Dredging Project Update

Those of us who have worked on the dredging project have gotten some great lessons and worked through some frustrations in working with bureaucracy, Indiana winters, and environmental red tape. We were dejected when things beyond our control pushed back our planned start date of fall 2014. Currently, we are poised to begin the project as soon as we get the environmental green light from the department of Fish and Wildlife.

Highlights of the Process thus far:

- After much work and planning in 2013, we submitted an application for a LARE (Lake and River Enhancement) grant in January 2014
- In March 2014 we learned we had won a \$200,000 LARE grant for sediment removal.
- In April the Simonton Lake Preservation Trust and the Environment committee began working to raise funds.
- In May 2014 we met with dredging contractors and began accepting bids for our project.
- In June, after learning more about the Basin requirements

for hydraulic dredging, we decided to rebid the project.

- In July 2014 we selected All Things Water as our dredging contractor and mechanical dredging as the method. The dredging contract came in just under \$300,000.
- In August 2014 we began a process of submitting plans and applications to numerous government agencies. One required application plan was over 200 pages.



- September 2014 we hand-delivered notices to property owners adjacent to dredging activity, and published public notice in the Elkhart Truth. The notice of intent (NOI) was approved for the project to begin on Oct 9th.
- In September, Amy Matherly announced the Trust had won a dredging grant from the Elkhart Community Foundation for \$50,000.
- The dredging contract took approximately 5 months to complete and was finally signed in mid-October.
- We began the land purchase negotiations in 2013 with an additional 4 months to finalize the purchase agreements and legal documents. The closing on the land was done at the end of October after seed corn was finally harvested by the farmer. We had hoped that the harvesting would occur earlier in the month. The SLPT's total land acquisition cost was approximately \$100,000.

Current Status as of March 2015

• Even though we did not take possession of the basin until late October, and despite heavy





snow in November, the basin was constructed. Among other things a berm had to be constructed around the perimeter.

- The dredger, in order to keep his men working, worked on other projects last fall as we finalized the land deal. With our basin ready he has now placed his machinery at the public landing poised to dredge.
- As the winter closed in the dredging company continued to work on a road way from the lake's edge to the basin as the weather allowed. This is now ready for hauling sediment.
- John Rose, Bob Evans and Stan Skinner have regular communication with the dredger.
- Neighborhood (Private) dredging will begin only after all of the public areas specified in our LARE grant application have been completed. Since the general dredging has not begun, Neighborhood Dredging may not start until fall. This gives lake residents additional time to send in Neighborhood Dredging applications.

NOTE: We are asking residents to avoid walking on the dredging activity sites, both the access to sediment basin and the roadway are privately owned and these construction areas are unsafe for nonconstruction individuals.





Simonton Lake Ecozone Approved by State

The Ecozone Committee has been notified that the Simonton Lake Ecozone has officially been approved. It now appears in official DNR state documents. Doug Keller, Aquatic Habitat Coordinator for the Indiana Department of Natural Resources has given us information on how to acquire buoys to mark the area.

You may remember that an ecozone is an area where natural aquatic plants are allowed to grow creating

a natural water filter for the lake. This was just one of the recommendations made by a Water Quality Study done on Simonton Lake in 2010.

Our ecozone will be located in the far southeastern corner of Little Simonton Lake, an area that is just a few inches deep. Restrictions in this zone are: only trolling motors, and no anchoring. The area will be monitored by DNR officers.




For many of us lake residents the summer

The Album of the Year was By the Time I Get to Phoenix by Glen Campbell.

The New York Jets with Joe Namath won the Super Bowl. UCLA beat Purdue to win the NCAA tournament. The New York Mets won the World Series and the Boston Celtics were NBA Champions. Rod Laver won the Men's championship at Wimbledon.

Led Zeppelin scheduled their first tour in 1969. Frank Sinatra released the song, My Way. The last issue of the Saturday Evening Post was published. In August the Manson family murders were the headlines in every newspaper. Fashion magazines featured Raquel Welch, Barbara Eden, Dianna Riggs and Jane Fonda. The first Gap clothing store opened in 1969.

As we are saddened by our good friends Bob and Joannie Church moving to the warmer


