
SAFETY REPORT



DO I HEAR A TRAIN?

Many times, especially in the evenings, area residents report hearing a train whistle. The nearest train tracks are miles away. To the west a railroad goes from Mishawaka through Granger and up into Michigan. Then there's the line that comes from Goshen along US 33. It turns westerly in downtown Elkhart. Finally, a line goes from Elkhart in a northeasterly fashion through Bristol.

So, why do we hear the trains? The answer is a scientific one: If there is a thermal inversion, i.e., a cool blanket of air on the ground with warm air above it, sound can travel for miles and miles. Sound bounces off the cool/warm air interface and gets directed back to the ground instead of going up into the sky. These thermal inversions typically occur in the evening after the sun goes down. The phenomenon is known as acoustic refraction.

OH! THOSE GEESE!!!

Less than fifty years ago, the giant Canada goose was extremely rare in Indiana. But now, after efforts to save an endangered breed, Canada geese are now quite common. The law in Indiana prohibits us from harvesting geese except during hunting season or by permit.

Here on Simonton Lake, we are not advocating killing off all the geese, although I admit that after picking up a bucket of goose droppings from my lawn, I have thought about it.

Why they like us so much:

We landowners have created an ideal goose habitat. Geese feed extensively on fresh, short, green grass. Geese, including their young, also have a strong tendency to return to the same area annually. Once geese start nesting in a particular place, it is likely more geese will nest there in the future.

There are many products on the market including lights that produce light that disrupts the sleep patterns of the geese, and "fences" that can be placed at the shoreline discouraging geese from coming into a lawn. In addition, several homeowners on the lake have purchased coyote decoys. I did that and found one day that the geese were taking selfies with the plastic coyote.

The State of Indiana offers two other ideas:

OIL THE EGGS

Once there are 5 eggs in a nest a thin coating of food-grade corn oil can be applied to the eggs which prevents them from hatching. Because the female has created her quota of eggs, she will not re-nest and lay more eggs. The Indiana DNR says that egg oiling is 95 to 100% effective. The problem with this solution is that you must watch for nesting to take place and check the nests daily for eggs and apply the oil with a rag or sprayer.

GET A PERMIT TO RELOCATE THE GEESE

The other solution is to get a state permit to relocate the geese. This can be done by an HOA or an individual landowner. Across the state there are several companies who do relocation. Of course, there is a fee for this service.

If you travel by boat down the Forest Road channel, make sure you look in the window


of the first house on the point on your way back out, as you might just see Inga sitting in her window perch watching the boats go by!







ASKED & ANSWERED

June 2021

Question: I am a new resident of Simonton Lake and live on a channel. My channel is full of these small green mats. I have raked out scores of these mats from the water in front of my home. Is this normal? What is this? Answer: For those of us who live at the lake these green mats or filamentous algae, also referred to as lake moss, are a yearly occurrence in the late spring or early summer.

SOME ALGAE IS GOOD FOR THE LAKE

Filamentous algae are colonies of microscopic plants that link together to form threads or mesh-like filaments. These primitive plants normally grow on the surface of rocks or objects under the water, but they can break loose and form floating mats. Filamentous algae are eaten by gadwall, lesser scaup, channel catfish and other organisms. They support aquatic insects, snails, and scuds (amphipods), which are important foods for fishes, ducks, amphibians and other organisms.

CAUSE OF TOO MUCH ALGAE

The cause of too much algae is an overabundance of nutrients, particularly phosphorus and nitrogen, in the water. The biggest contributor of phosphorus in the lake is soil runoff.

Algae is not all bad. We don't want to wipe it out altogether. It is important to the ecology of the lake unless it gets to a point of overwhelming the entire lake which would harm water quality, food resources and habitats, and decrease the oxygen that fish and other aquatic life need to survive.

This is why the Lake Association pays so much attention to water quality and invasive weed control. Everything in the lake ecology needs to be in balance.

Bottom line: It will go away. As a new resident we want to warn you up front that in August when the good weeds in the lake grow tall and are cut off by propellers those weeds will float up. It's just part of life at the lake.

OTHER ALTERNATIVES:

- Leaves can be dropped off at the Elkhart County Landfill for no cost. The landfill is at 59530 County Road 7 South of Elkhart.
- If you have a compost pile or bin, leaves can be added.
- Placing leaves in your garden in the fall will bring you enriched garden soil come spring.

IF YOU ARE SUFFERING FROM A NEIGHBOR'S FIRE:

- Talk to your neighbor.
- If necessary, call the Elkhart County Police and let them know you are having trouble breathing because of a fire in the neighborhood.

If you must burn, be sure to follow the Elkhart Count burning ordinance: Fires must be attended during burning until completely extinguished.


- A fire must be extinguished at any time if it creates a:
 - Pollution problem
 - Threat to public health
 - Nuisance
 - Fire hazard
- Burning may not be conducted during high winds, temperature inversions, air stagnation, or when a pollution alert or air quality action day has been declared.
- Private residential open burning must be during daylight hours. All fires must be extinguished before sunset. (Recreational or ceremonial fires are allowed after sunset but cannot be used for disposal purposes.)

DNR recommends removal of feeders and bird baths statewide

Adapted from a DNR press release

After receiving reports of sick and dying birds, DNR recommends Indiana residents cease feeding all birds statewide. Bird feeders, bird baths, and other sources that encourage the congregation of wild birds should be taken down or discontinued. Feeders and baths should be cleaned with 10% bleach solution and stored until more information is available.

REPORTING SICK BIRDS

Residents who find birds with eye or head swelling, crusty discharge around the eyes, and/or neurological signs (e.g., tremors, stumbling, weakness, lethargy) should submit the sighting to on.IN.gov/sickwildlife. Biologists are actively tracking reports, and samples have been submitted to


the Indiana Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory. No definitive cause of death has been identified at this time.

BACKGROUND

- In late May, DNR started receiving reports of sick and dying songbirds from Monroe County with neurological signs, eye swelling, and crusty discharge around the eyes.
- Reports of sick and dying birds now include 50 counties, including Elkhart, Kosciusko, LaGrange, and St. Joe.
- The following species are principally affected: blue jay, American robin, common grackle, starling, northern cardinal, brown-headed cowbird.

- DNR staff have collected samples and submitted them to the Indiana Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory. Final laboratory diagnostic results are pending the cause or transmission is currently unknown and still under investigation.
- All birds have tested negative for avian influenza and West Nile virus.
- As the investigation continues, the DNR recommends all Hoosiers remove their birdfeeders, including those for hummingbirds, statewide.

NOTE: Several local residents have reported dead birds on their property. This is affecting birds in the Simonton Lake area!


